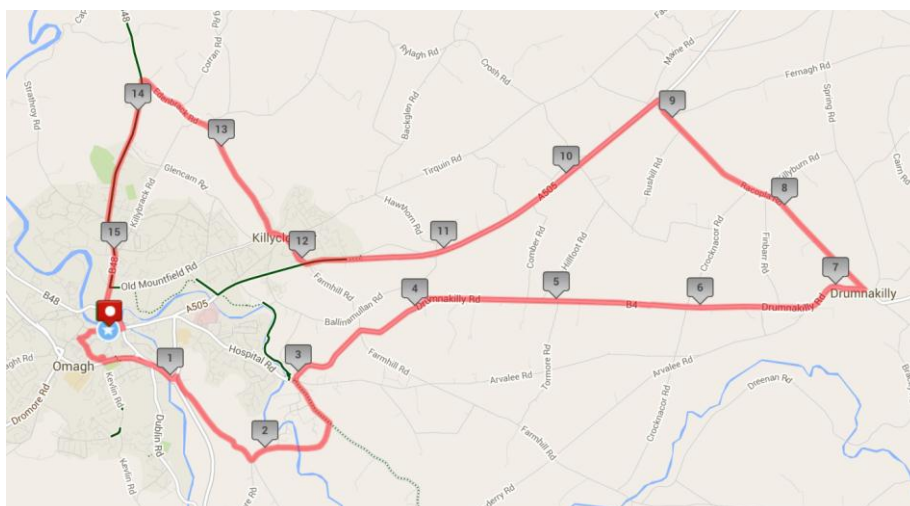
Road race route details revealed

Details of this years National Championship road race course were revealed by Race Director Stevie McKenna at the recent launch event in Omagh. Based on a 15-mile lap, the course looks set to be both technical and challenging.

McKenna said it's going to be fast but tough on the legs, "The course will come through Omagh town centre each lap which will provide lots of excitement and action for spectators, but also will offer riders the thrill of racing through a packed town. There are a number of short sharp hills, and dead stops on the course such as 'Sallys Corner' which will lend itself to an attacking race, and no doubt plenty of line-outs. There will also be spectator sections out on the course to create an atmosphere out on the exciting parts of the road".

After navigating the town centre, the race will head towards Carrickmore before turning left after Drumnakilly onto 'JMG Hill'. The race will then flow onto the Cookstown road before re-entering the town via a fast section via Killyclogher. It turns back into the countryside over a lumpy St Mary's road which will no doubt hurt the legs over it's sharp snappy terrain. The race then turns back for Omagh and travels at high speed back along the Gortin road. It's set to provide plenty of fast action and excitement.

Race Headquarters for the road race will be at the Omagh Leisure Centre.
